The Very Vocal Heidi

Anna and her family had Dobermanns previously and struggled with the known issue of shorter lifespans. After their last Dobermann before Heidi, they decided to take a break from having a dog and then of course Covid happened. During this time the family took care of a friend's small breed dog and thought that they were ready to have another dog but maybe a small breed this time. With the desire re-ignited, they started submitting applications for small dogs at a variety of different rescues, sadly none of the applications were successful (or maybe not so sad). Anna and her family thought again about having another Dobermann with the lack of success adopting a small dog, and found Lincs Dobermann Rescue. With the waiting that they had already done, it seemed like a good idea to submit an application and wait and see what happened. Not expecting a quick response, it came as a surprise that just a week and a half later Julie from Lincs called to say that there might be a Dobermann that could fit in with Anna's family.

With the phone call received, Anna and her family made the arrangements to meet up with Morag and Julie, and to meet the potential new addition to their home. Enter Heidi, a beautiful 5-year-old Dobermann. It was love at first sight for both Heidi and Anna's family. Entering the field Heidi approached the family and promptly rolled on her back. In that moment Anna and her family knew they had found the right dog for them and just wanted to take her home that day.

Heidi was being rehomed due to heath issues in her previous family but Heidi had also had 3 litters of puppies by the time she was given to Lincs. Heidi has proven to be a lovely addition to the family, though it has not been without some bumps in the road. Heidi pawed at the youngest child due to anxiety so Anna reached out to Lincs about what to do. Lincs were able to provide advice and support to help Anna and her family work through these minor issues that were experienced. These issues are something that is a part of a rescue Dobie settling in, it takes time for them to relax and fully trust everyone in the family. Heidi has become very family-oriented and sociable with people she knows but can be wary of strangers and barks at them.

Exercise is important for this beautiful breed and Anna takes Heidi running to ensure Heidi has the exercise and stimulation she needs. With Heidi settled into family life, there were still some surprises to come. Heidi has proven to be particularly vocal using grunts, snoring, and just about every other sound to communicate her needs (this includes being extra vocal when she wants a cuddle). Anna's previous Dobies hadn't been quite as vocal as Heidi has become.

Anna highlighted that her experience with Lincs Dobermann Rescue has been wonderful, finding the team really helpful and supportive. This has instilled a desire to rescue another dog when the time comes. It has also inspired Anna to get involved in fundraising for Lincs Dobermann Rescue. It should be noted that Anna felt Lincs took the time to ensure their Dobies find the right home, almost having a sixth sense in being able to find the right matches. Anna and her family might have rescued Heidi but Heidi has also rescued Anna and her family, having such a positive, loving impact on the whole family.

Preston Trick Dogs put on a spectacular show with their dancing dogs, ensuring everyone was thoroughly entertained. There was raffles and prizes at the different vendors, just to add a little more excitement to the day. As the day wrapped up, with more than a few soggy humans and dogs, the sun came out to shine; late as usual (forecasted to stop raining around 12pm, the sun actually shined a bit around 4pm a).

This means that training is highly recommend for Dobies and their owners to help create a beautiful, loving, and harmonious relationship. Dobies are proven to be very smart and highly trainable, so not only is it recommended but can also give you ideas on stimulating your Dobies' brains. The training provided on these days is invaluable to both the owners and Dobies.

On Sunday 14th April, the trainers showed an amazing amount of patience throughout the day, providing help to all attending through sharing their vast knowledge. Topics that were covered on the day included but were not limited to:

- How dogs learn
- Dog behaviour and mindset for training

- Recall

The 3-3-3 Rule of Adopting a Rescue Dog (This is a general guideline; all dogs are unique and will adjust to their new environments in their own time.)



In the first 3 days, your new dog may feel overwhelmed, be scared and unsure of what is going on, not comfortable with themselves or their surroundings, they may not want to eat or drink, shut down and want to curl up in their crate or hide, and finally may test the boundaries.





After 3 weeks, your new dog may start to show signs of settling, feel more comfortable in the environment and with the people of the house, understand the routine, start showing their true personality. At this point any behavioural issues may start to show up.



After 3 months, your new dog should feel settled in their new home, have built a bond with the people of the house and be showing signs of trust in the surroundings and people, feeling secure with the home and family, and be settled into a routine.

ADOPTION TIPS

- 1. Do your research on the breed you want to adopt. Dobermanns are a large breed that require exercise and lots of attention. They also take up lots of space.
- 2. Get your application in early. By the time you see a post on a Dobie that is ready for adoption, it is likely a match has been found from the existing waitlist.
- 3. Be patient. The right Dobie is out there for you but it may take some time for them to find you.
